

SCREEN 1: Click on "Cast My Vote".



SCREEN 2: Click on "I am a Representative of a Business or a Power of Attorney."






SCREEN 3:

Enter the business/power of attorney member number or business/power of attorney debit card number and business/power of attorney postal code.

Click "Submit".



NOTE:

If the Representative for the Business or Power of Attorney **IS** also a personal member of Access Credit Union, continue to screen 4 in the guide.

If the Representative for the Business or Power of Attorney is **NOT** a personal member of Access Credit Union, skip to screen 5 in the guide.


SCREEN 4:

Enter your personal member number **OR** personal debit card number.

Enter your Date of Birth OR Postal Code.

Read and accept (use check box) the declaration statement.

Click "Submit".

MOBILE APP:

from a mobile device, login to mobile banking; select one of your accounts and click on the forward facing arrow (>) to view Account Details.




ONLINE BANKING:

from a browser, login to the online banking platform; under "My Accounts" the Membership number is listed on the top of the Account Summary page.






SCREEN 5:

To continue, click "Next".




SCREEN 6:

Click "Next".






SCREEN 7:


Review your selections and click "Confirm" to officially cast your ballot.

Voter Eligibility

GENERAL VOTING GUIDELINES

- · Must be a member one share one vote.
- Must be over the age of 18 years.

VOTING ON BEHALF OF A CORPORATION OR ASSOCIATION

Corporate Resolution – Business members of the Credit Union must appoint a representative to cast a vote on behalf of the organization. Corporate voting resolutions submitted for past votes remain in effect until they are cancelled or revoked in writing by the Company/Association.

In accordance with the voting notice, all Corporate Resolutions were to be received by Friday, April 5, 2024 at 12:00 p.m.

A member that is a corporation or association must appoint a representative to vote on its behalf by completing a resolution [refer to: subsection 68(1) of the Act].

TYPES OF CORPORATIONS OR ASSOCIATIONS

- Registered corporations, for example:
 - » ABC Sewing Inc., ABC Sewing Ltd., ABC Sewing Corporation; ABC Sewing Corp.
- Non-profit organizations active and organized sports teams.
- Where there are several sub accounts under the same org record (applies to corporations and non-profit organizations) that entity has one vote, for example:
 - » XYZ Church Ltd may have a separate missions account, youth group account, ladies group account or Sunday School account, they are deemed to be one entity – under the primary account holder, in this case XYZ Church Ltd. is allowed one vote.

Types of Business that are not allowed to vote as they are not considered a body corporate and are not an entity that can vote:

- Sole Proprietorship/Trading As Businesses, for example:
 - » Joe Smith operating or trading as Joe's Hauling.
- · Partnerships, for example:
 - » Joe Smith and Jane Doe operating or trading as J & J Lawn Care

Proxy Voting

· Access Credit Union's by-laws do not allow voting by proxy.

TRUST ACCOUNTS

- · Not eligible for voting
 - » The trustee cannot vote on behalf of the beneficial owner as that would be deemed to be voting by proxy

ESTATE ACCOUNTS

· Not eligible to vote – executors would be deemed to vote by proxy and the by-laws do not allow a proxy vote

POWERS OF ATTORNEY

• Powers of attorney may vote on behalf of another member if the Credit Union has received a copy of the power of attorney document and the document specifies that they may vote on behalf of the Member.

NEW MEMBERSHIPS AND VOTING ELIGIBILITY

- The cut-off for voting eligibility is governed by Section 62 of the Act, which states that the record date for determining which members are entitled to receive notice of a meeting of members is the closing of business on the day immediately preceding the day on which notice is given.
- Notice will be posted in the local newspapers, therefore in order to be eligible to vote the membership must have been opened by the close of March 18th, 2024.

MINORS' VOTING RIGHTS

• No member who is under the age of 18 may vote [subsection 67(1)].
